RECENT COUNCIL DECISIONS

• Councillors have endorsed the name Grenda Lane for central Dandenong's newest street – which runs north-south between George St and Halpin Way.

Councillors endorsed the new name, which must still be approved by the Victorian Government's Office of Geographic Place Names.

The name celebrates the historic connection of the Grenda family and their iconic local business Grenda Bus Company which contributed enormously to transport and employment in the area.

• Councillors adopted a new Fireworks Policy to ensure the safe use of fireworks at public events.

All fireworks must be approved in writing by Council and comply with a range of rules to ensure the community's safety and amenity. Fireworks displays are generally allowed only up until 9.30pm and advance notice must be given to nearby properties – to allow nearby pet owners to secure animals.

• Council has approved plans to extend and upgrade recreation facilities at the Willow Lodge retirement village in Bangholme.

The works include a new dining room and kitchen, movie theatre, gymnasium and indoor pool.

• Councillors approved a 12-year contract, following a public tender process, for the supply of green electricity and reticulated hot water service for the new municipal building in Dandenong.

The contract is part of Council's effort to design and construct using sustainable principles and will help the building achieve a five-star GreenStar rating.



OLIVE O'DONOGHUE Widow of late Arthur (Paddy)

Council marked the passing of Olive O'Donoghue, 96, a well-known and much-loved Noble Park identity who passed away peacefully at Noble Manor in late August.

Olive was a trustee of the Noble Park Public Hall, now the Paddy O'Donoghue Centre, for 33 years.

She received the Foundation Award for "giving selfless lifetime" service and commitment to Noble Park" which was announced at the Noble Park Centenary celebrations in 2009.

Mayor Angela Long said Olive will always hold a very special place in Noble Park's history.

"Throughout her life Olive served on numerous local committees for the Noble Park state school, Truby King Centre and Pre-school, Dandenong and District Historical Society and the Dandenong Music Festival."

Silverleaf Ward Cr John Kelly

I'm pleased to announce a local family-owned business has been awarded a \$466,000 grant from the Victorian Government to expand.

Dandenong South recycling facility Waste Converters Recycling does great work recycling waste products that would otherwise be dumped in landfill.

The government grant will allow them to double recycling capacity from 50,000 tonnes to 100,000 tonnes and will create 15 new jobs in the area.

This is great news for the environment and for our local business sector.

Much of their work centres on recycling timber packaging waste from local industry - they repair minor damage, make new packaging or mulch the waste timber to be used as landscaping mulch.

Managing Director Ward Petherbridge also runs the annual Create from a Crate competition with artists and craftsmen given the challenge to create an object using only materials from a wooden pallet.

The decade-old competition attracts entries from near and far with creations including furniture, clocks and musical instruments such as violins and harps.

An exhibition of this year's entries will be held as part of the Sustainable Living Festival, while next year's entries will be showcased at our very own Walker Street Gallery in February 2015.

I'd like to congratulate Waste Converters Recycling on receiving this impressive grant and wish them all the best for a successful future in Greater Dandenong as they play a key role in helping us build a more sustainable future. The City of Greater Dandenong is making important changes to your residential rubbish, recycling and garden waste kerbside collection services.

Council has appointed a new waste collection contractor - JJ Richards starting this month.

JJ Richards' garbage trucks feature state-of-the-art technology to provide improved service and advice to the community including:

- direct on-board reporting of issues to ensure prompt follow-up action and reduce the need for customers to report concerns
- on-board video technology to assess bin contents - allowing for advice and education on

recycling to be provided where it is most needed

• improved technology to help drivers complete their routes and ensure no streets are overlooked.

Collection drivers will also monitor the condition of your bins and can conduct minor on-the-spot repairs or request a replacement bin on your behalf.

JJ Richards will start waste collections in Greater Dandenong from the beginning of October and will roll-out a brand new fleet of brightly coloured trucks to celebrate.

The new trucks feature key waste messages to remind the community that a sustainable future is in everybody's hands.

The bins come in a range of sizes Dandenong households will be contacted to nominate their preferred bin option.

The new bins feature black bodies with different coloured lids for each yellow lid for recycling and green lid for garden waste.

The new colour scheme is in line with the Australian standard and matches bins found at public venues and events - to help make sorting

ave you ever wondered what happens to your recycled waste, household rubbish and green waste once it gets emptied by the trucks?

Would you like to learn more about reducing your waste going to landfill & how to become a better recycler?

The City of Greater Dandenong is giving you the chance to find out at our free Follow your Waste tours.

The free tour will be held 9.30am to 3pm on Tuesday 22 October and Tuesday 26 November.

First stop on the tour will be the Polytrade Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Dandenong South to learn how recyclable material gets sorted, packed and processed into new products.

The next stop is a landfill facility in Hallam to learn how a landfill is constructed and what happens to garbage once it reaches landfill. We will also tour NRS in Dandenong to see first-hand how green waste is turned into quality compost and mulch.

The tour finishes with lunch and a tour of Alex Wilkie Nature Reserve in Springvale South.

Keeping our HISTORY ALIVE

eritage works at the Drum Theatre are helping keep Dandenong's history alive.

Council has adopted a 10year plan to conserve and restore the magnificent icon, with ongoing works regularly taking place.

Over the past 12 months works have included:

 restoration and repainting of the first-floor function rooms, corridor and largescale feature wall - the works have breathed new life into the tastefully restored historic former Mechanics Insititute reading and committee rooms.

 ventilation works to the Magistrates Room flooring.

The Drum Theatre - a 521 seat state-of-the-art purposebuilt performing arts venue - is located within the heritage façade of the former 1890 Dandenong Town Hall.



NEW FACE OF DANDENONG

he face of Dandenong's new municipal building is taking shape thanks to recent progress at the site.

Construction works are continuing at full steam on-site with a host of verv visible changes including completion of the striking sandstone cladding on the building's exterior and landscaping works underway.

Inside there's plenty of action taking place with plasterboarding and tiling complete throughout the five-level building; plantroom completed and lift installation underway.

The project is due for completion early next year with Council aiming to be open for business from the new building in April 2014.

It will include:

- a state-of-the-art regional library
- new Council offices, city chambers and community meeting rooms
- open-air civic plaza with giant outdoor video screen
- retail areas, cafes and office space available for lease.



SPRINGVALE crossing update

Significant progress was made on the Springvale Level Crossing Removal project over the past few weeks.

Major works required the recent closure of Springvale Road to build the new bridge deck – which will now allow works to begin on the rail cutting beneath Springvale Rd.

Over at the train station the entrance to Platform 2 has been relocated along Sandown Rd following a two-week platform closure for structural works.

During October VicRoads will continue piling works and will begin large-scale excavation works on the rail cutting.

The VicRoads project team has also been busy building community links including running a drawing competition for Noble Park Special Development School students to imagine what Springvale will look like 20 years from now.

ALL ABILITIES

New equipment installed at Dandenong Oasis is helping people of all abilities enjoy the pools.

Two new hoists provide easy access to the 50-metre pool and hydrotherapy pool while an aquatic wheelchair accesses the beach entry to the toddler and fun pool.

A new change bed with rails has been installed in the hydrotherapy pool change area.

The improvements are part of the City of Great Dandenong's commitment to improve disability access at recreation centres.

Providing all-ability access was a key issue during design of the new Noble Park Aquatic Centre (NPAC) – which was built on a single level with no steps and with ramp access to both pools.

NPAC is used by a number of allability groups with some travelling large distances due to the accessibility-friendly design.



Step out for healthy living

You're invited to put on your walking shoes and get active with Walkfest, an all-ability all-ages event to promote healthy living.

Four accessible walks will be held around Dandenong on Friday 25 October with different distances to suit all abilities.

All walks finish at Hemmings Park with a free event featuring live

performances from talented locals.

This is a free community event, but bring along some loose change for a coffee from the coffee cart.

The schools concert is an annual event that showcases the talents of local students through performances exploring issues of respect, harmony, faith and diversity.




Greater Dandenong Mayor Angela Long said the network's partnership with local schools was to be commended.
